

Introduction to IO1

The Introduction to Pedagogy Programme will be developed in 2 distinct phases. This is how it fits within the timeline of the family learning approach to preventing domestic violence:



This induction programme for parents will address best practice pedagogic approaches to support their role as primary educators and as facilitators of learning in a family setting.



IO 1: Induction to Pedagogy Programme for Parents

Phase 1: Induction to Pedagogy Workshops

Developed by Ballybeen Women's Centre by month 12

2 half day workshops including lesson plans, Powerpoint slides, activities and handouts

Will address the pedagogic elements of the curriculum and support parents in their new roles as facilitators of family learning.

10 parents will complete this initial pedagogic training in each partner country.

Phase 2: Using the Family Learning Toolkit Workshops

Developed by Right Challenge Association months 15 – 18 once the Family Learning Toolkit (IO 3) has been completed

2 half day workshops including lesson plans, Powerpoint slides, activities and handouts.

Will introduce parents to the comic strips, interactive magazine and audio books; present practical advice and methods to applying these digital tools in a family learning environment.

Will be delivered to the 10 parents who completed Phase 1.



Tasks for Partners

- **BWC** will develop a value proposition that outlines the knowledge, skills and attitudes to be achieved for each of their 2 proposed workshops. BWC will develop the templates to be used to produce the practical workshop sessions, and will develop the content for workshops 1 and 2. **BWC** will also test all workshop content and implement the training with 10 local parents.
- **RCA** will develop a value proposition that outlines the knowledge, skills and attitudes to be achieved for each of their 2 proposed workshops once the content of the Family Learning Toolkit is signed off in English and will develop the content for workshops 3 and 4. **RCA** will also test all workshop content and translate all content of the Induction to Pedagogy Programme for Parents. **RCA** will implement the training with 10 local parents.
- **SRC** will test all workshop content and brand all of the curriculum content produced for the practical workshops. **SRC** will implement the training with 10 local parents.
- **SIC, CARDET** and **FHB** will test all workshop content, translate all content of the Induction to Pedagogy Programme for Parents and will implement the training with 10 local parents.
- **SKILLS ZONE** will test all workshop content and will implement the training with 10 local parents.
- **CARDET** will upload all materials in all partner languages to the project website.



Phase 1 – Induction to Pedagogy Workshops

These workshops aim to support parents to:

1. Understand pedagogy approaches to learning.
1. Understand what family learning is.
2. Understand how children and young people develop.
3. Understand how children and young people learn.
4. Understand the different roles parents can play in family learning.
5. Develop their skills and confidence as facilitators of learning.



Phase 1 - Induction to Pedagogy Workshops

Knowledge

Theoretical knowledge of pedagogic approaches.
Definition of family learning.
Theoretical knowledge of how children develop and learn.
Theoretical knowledge of parental roles in family learning.
Factual knowledge of best facilitation practices.

Skills

List different ages and stages of children's development.
List different parental roles for learning.
Integration of pedagogic approaches in family learning
Develop and put facilitation skills into practice
Plan and create supportive family learning opportunities.

Attitudes

Willingness to learn the basic theory.
Increase in confidence in own abilities as parent facilitators.
Willingness to participate in family learning opportunities.


Templates
